**Michael M. Geduldig, M.D.**

**Past PSG President**

**1992-1993**

The PSG family mourns the loss of Dr. Michael Geduldig of Mechanicsburg who passed away peacefully at his home on December 13, 2019 at the age of 89. Dr. Geduldig was the President of the PSG from 1992-1993. Originally from Brooklyn, New York, Dr. Geduldig started his college education at Cornell University at age 16, graduating with a degree in biochemistry. He earned his medical degree from New York University College of Medicine. Dr. Geduldig served as a captain in the United States Army Medical Corps, stationed in Germany, in the late 1950s. He completed his internship, residency, and a fellowship at Johns Hopkins in Baltimore, Maryland. He then moved to Harrisburg in 1964 to establish a medical practice. He was the first board-certified gastroenterologist in central Pennsylvania. Dr. Geduldig was recognized for his clinical expertise and compassionate care of patients and their families. Throughout his career, he held appointments as Professor of Medicine and Director of Gastroenterology at Hahnemann Medical College, Professor of Medicine Emeritus at Hershey Medical School, and as noted previously, President of our Pennsylvania Society of Gastroenterology. For years he served in leadership positions at local hospitals, and was a member of multiple professional organizations and associations. Michael was a relentlessly curious person, a Civil War buff who audited college history classes well into his late 70s. He was a voracious reader, an avid gardener, worldwide traveler and master bread baker. Our sincere condolences to his family and friends.
